

# What occurs when I enroll in a clinical trial?



## 1. Knowledge

You learn about alternative treatments known as **Clinical Trials**.

## 2. Pre-screening Questions

If you contact a research center, the team will ask you a series of brief questions about you and your health.

*The research team can contact you by phone call or text message*



## 3. Screening Questions

The research team will ask you more specific questions to verify if the study is appropriate for you.

*If you have any doubt or questions, feel free to contact the research team as they are equipped to resolve all your concerns.*



## 4. Informed Consent

The research team will explain to you what is the informed consent, a document explaining the study procedure, visit schedule, compensation, and your rights as a participant.



## 6. Follow-up

The research study will ensure your well-being and safety and will follow up closely on your treatment.

*The duration of the visit schedule will depend on the trial. Length of visits schedule will be explained during the informed consent.*



## 5. Appointments

The study has a schedule of visits, some of which may include particular tests or appointments with the treating physician.
